CHARLES B. COZADD ROTARY FOUNDATION, INC.

The Cozadd Rotary Foundation is the funding arm of the Belleville Rotary Club. Originally, the Belleville Rotary Club Foundation was managed by the Rotary Club Board of Directors. In December 1987, fund management was put under professional fund managers with National Bank of Detroit (now BankOne). Subsequently, the name of the Foundation was changed to the Charles B. Cozadd Rotary Foundation as a subsidiary of the Belleville Rotary Club (in honor of Charles Cozadd, a charter member of the Rotary Club and the impetus behind the creation of the Foundation).

The 7-member Board of Directors is made up of four Belleville Rotarians and three non-Rotarians of good standing in the community. They are elected by the Belleville Rotary Club on staggered three-year terms in June of each year. Fund requests are received for consideration each March and September. No individuals or individual projects are funded by the Foundation, and all funded projects have a community-wide benefit. The current Foundation Board is as follows:

GUIDELINES FOR APPLICATION FOR FUNDS**

- **Application deadlines are March 1st and September 1st of each year. Applications received after the deadline will be held for consideration at the next funding cycle.**
- **Funding will not be provided to or for individuals regardless of the need or worthiness of the project. The Foundation is primarily interested in projects that have a community-wide impact (Belleville, Sumpter and Van Buren). There must be accountability, follow-up and reporting for each application to be considered.**
- **A signed original and six (6) copies of the completed application and supporting materials must be submitted to the Foundation's office.**

Each application must contain each of the following in this order:

- 1. Name, address, telephone/fax/e-mail numbers, the date and the name of the responsible or lead individual for the organization or group applying.**
- 2. Describe in detail the project/program for funds being requested. Be as specific as possible.**
- 3. In what time frame will this project/program be undertaken and completed?**
- 4. List sources and amounts of any funds available in addition to Foundation funds. When will you need Foundation funds and in what amounts?**
- 5. By what methods and when will you measure the effectiveness of the project/program? What will you do with this information?**
- 6. What do you envision the short and long-term effects of this project to be? Be specific.**
- 7. Describe your organizational structure, goals and membership requirements.**
- 8. Will you supply us with a final report of the completion and effectiveness of your program? When and how?**
- 9. List anything else you want us to know about your program, organization, etc., that will assist us to make the best decision on your request.**

If you have questions or comments feel free to contact the Foundation office at any time. Be certain to follow the above listed points exactly in the application.
